Part I Total Crime

February has been a significantly better month for crime than January. Both Violent Crime and Property Crime rates decreased, with 34 (30%) fewer Part I crimes this month.

In accordance with last month's report, this year continues to be better than average overall when it comes to Violent Crime.

January was 53% below the 5-Year average for Violent Crime, and this month was even better, putting the city at 65% below the average amount.

That being said, Property Crimes like Larceny are still, unfortunately, on the rise, comparatively.

Part I Violent Crime

Pittsfield seems to headed in the right direction this year when it comes to Violent Crime. We've had 4 fewer cases (21% less) violent offenses this year compared to the same time last year, and are well below the average amount for the month of February (by 11 cases, 65%).

The only area of Violent Crime that has increased is Robbery, which coincides with the rise in Larceny. Stealing, in many forms, seems to be on the rise in Pittsfield this year.

The decrease in Aggravated Assault cases, however, is commendable. The 5-Year average for February is 13 cases. This year, we only had 1.







What You Can Do

With Larceny and Robbery rates increasing in Pittsfield, it is important to know how to protect yourself. Here are a few suggestions on how you can help prevent theft from happening to you.

- •Cars— Make sure to always lock your vehicle and park in well—lit areas when possible. Remove wallets, cell phones, GPS units, and other potentially valuable items from your vehicle. Even small items, like chargers and loose change should be removed or kept out of sight.
- •<u>Home</u>— Keep valuable items out of sight from your windows, and make sure basement and garage entrances are secured. Avoid inviting people you don't know well into your home. If you do, put valuable items like electronics, money, and checks out of sight or in a locked room beforehand.
- •Purses, Wallets, etc— When carrying only a wallet, avoid putting it in your back pocket. Most pickpocket strategies can be foiled simply by putting your wallet in a different pocket. Purses should be tucked securely under your arm when worn on the shoulder, and should be zipped close to avoid anyone from reaching inside.
